## Billy Don Sims Scholarship Update!

Thank You ...Thank You...What a GREAT team effort in 2011! I am pleased to report that the results of the 8<sup>th</sup> Annual BDS Golf Scramble and other fund raising efforts were a fantastic success in 2011! As many of you know, since its inception in 2004, the Alabama Chapter through its scholarship committee has now provided scholarships to nine recipients totaling \$8,700. Information about the 2011 winner Brianna Jeffery is featured in this newsletter.

I want to personally say <u>Thanks to all of YOU</u>, both individuals and organizations, for your generous support and effort given to this year's events. This year's golf scramble collected \$3,565.00 from players Thanks to the generous contribution of long time player and supporter Mr. Howard Burt who contributed \$1,000.00. Individuals and organizations from all over Alabama contributed \$8,410.00 resulting in a total of \$11,975.00. Expenses related to the golf event and awarding the 2011 scholarship of \$2,000.00 totaled \$3,638.87 resulting in a net growth to the fund of \$8,336.13.

Thanks to Julie Brock and Caitlin Simpson for spear heading the silent auction. Their effort produced \$705.00 towards the fund's growth. Thanks to Greg Rowe who handled the 50-50 raffle which produced \$237.50 towards the fund's growth. Congratulations to Johnny Boshell the 50-50 winner! The "Tip of the Hat" award goes to Curtis Glisson for his vision and effort to replace "Lights Out Bowling" due to the closure of the bowling alley in Eufaula with the 1<sup>st</sup> ever "BINGO BLAST". This effort generated \$1,521.08 in revenue for the fund. The net across all events resulted in a gain of \$10,799.71 for 2011!

The current BDS CD of \$61,600 will mature March 16, 2012, at which time the interest earned will be \$1,373.08, and the 2011 gain of \$10,799.71 will be added resulting in \$73,772.79 in the fund. As the AER board well knows I distain odd numbers and will be asking for an AER general fund contribution of \$1,227.21 to renew the CD at \$75,000.00! With two successful years in 2012 and 2013 we can reach the BDS fund GOAL of \$100,000.00.

Since its inception in 2004 the scholarship mission of assisting persons who want to work in the field of blindness and to celebrate the professional contribution that Don Sims made to the field of blindness has resulted in raising \$82,479.79. **Thank you for your continued support!** Joe Helm

### **RRTC Research Project in Alabama is Underway**

Our current NIDRR-funded RRTC on Employment Outcomes for Individuals who are Blind or Visually Impaired includes a research project developing, implementing, and evaluating an innovative transportation intervention intended to improve employment outcomes for state vocational rehabilitation (VR) consumers who are blind or visually impaired. This project is being conducted in conjunction with Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services. All referrals are through area counselors. ### New! Participant Registry for Blindness and Low Vision Research

### Mentee Eligibility Recruitment Criteria Expanded

MSU-RRTC is continuing active, nationwide recruitment of legally blind college students and professionals for "<u>An Employment Mentoring Intervention</u>," one of six research projects under our current NIDRR RRTC on Employment Outcomes for Individuals who are Blind or Visually Impaired. Mentees must be undergraduate or graduate students under the age of 35 who are legally blind. They must expect to seek employment after graduation, and have basic computer literacy and ability to access online materials. New guidelines expand eligibility to include students who will graduate between April 2012 and December 2014.

Mentors must be legally blind, currently employed or retired from a professional career, and must have basic computer literacy and ability to access online materials.
